



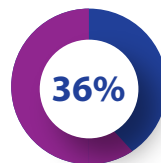

More than **50%** of acute HCV cases will progress to chronic infection.<sup>1</sup>

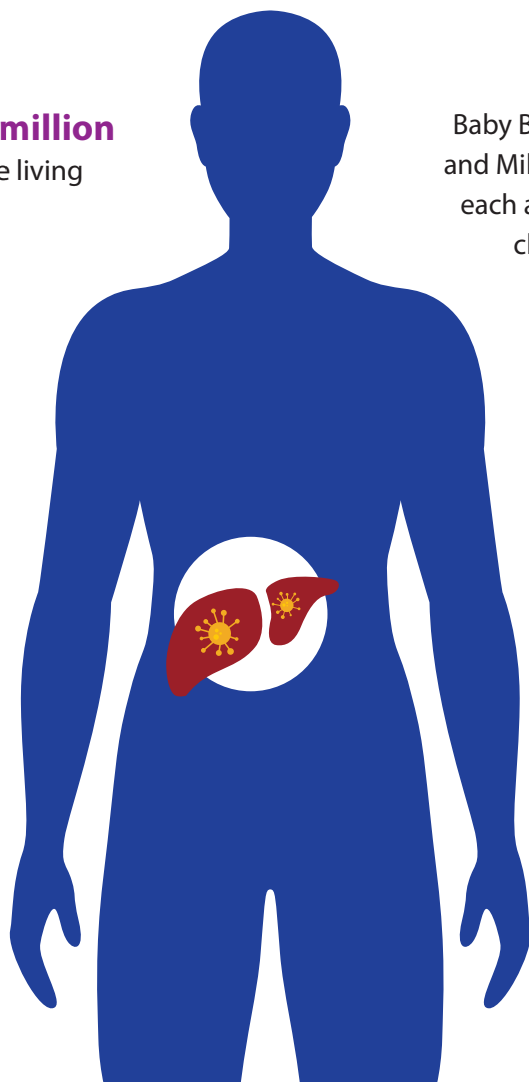
Left undiagnosed, HCV can cause liver damage, cirrhosis and cancer.

# Everyone age 18+ should be tested for HCV

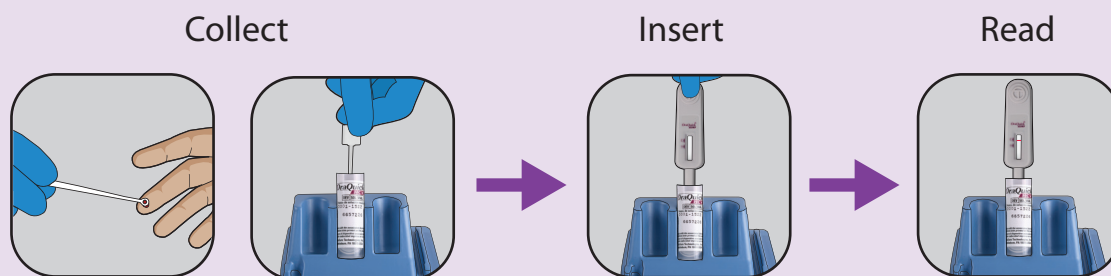


The CDC recommends hepatitis C (HCV) screening at least once in a lifetime for all adults aged 18 years and older, except in settings where the prevalence of HCV infection (HCV RNA-positivity) is less than 0.01%.<sup>3</sup>

- Pregnant women should be tested during each pregnancy.
- People with ongoing risk factors should receive routine periodic testing, including people who inject drugs.
- Any person who requests testing should receive it.
